



Sustainability Town Hall Meeting Draws Over 600

Citizens of all ages came together on March 31st to envision a sustainable future for Corvallis. The 500-seat ballroom at the CH2M Hill Alumni Center was alive with energy as participants gathered at tables of 10 to respond to two questions: "What would a sustainable Corvallis look like?" and "How will we get there?" Many League members participated in the discussions.

Interest in the Sustainability Town Hall meeting was so strong that an overflow room was added to accommodate 100 additional attendees. The meeting drew a diverse crowd, including an unusually high number of high school and college students. "Focus on the Future, Action in the Present" was the theme, and participants were asked to aim high in their goal-setting. A sustainable community is defined as one that meets the needs of the present without

compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.

The Town Hall meeting marked the launch of an 8-month public process that will culminate in a community sustainability action plan by December 2008. At the close of the gathering, attendees were asked to sign up to serve on work groups that will meet during the next several months to formulate target goals, measurable objectives, and action strategies in a variety of topic areas (e.g., energy, housing, food, water, health, etc.). Nearly 200 people responded to the call.

The work groups will present an interim report and seek feedback from the community at the second Town Hall meeting on June 25. A third Town Hall gathering is scheduled for October 7. Mark your calendar!

In March, the Corvallis Sustainability Coalition and the Energy Trust of Oregon launched a year-long campaign to promote energy efficiency and the use of renewable energy in Corvallis. To kick off the challenge, Energy Trust invited partner organizations in the Sustainability Coalition to enter a competition: the organization that signs up the most people for a free Home Energy Review by Earth Day (April 22) will win \$1,000.

Our League is neck-in-neck with First Alternative Co-op for first place! As of April 5, we had nearly 90 sign-ups. But we need more to win. If you have not already done so, please sign

up for a free home energy review – and ask your friends, neighbors, and colleagues to do so, as well.

During the one-hour review, an Energy Trust energy advisor will check your home for opportunities to save both energy and money. The advisor will also install FREE compact fluorescent light bulbs and FREE faucet aerators and efficient showerheads.
